The Embassy of the United States of America in London to the Foreign and Commonwealth Office

19 April 2012

The Embassy of the United States of America has the honor to refer the Foreign and Commonwealth Office to the Agreement between the Government of the United States of America and the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland on Cooperation in Science and Technology for Critical Infrastructure Protection and Other Homeland/Civil Security Matters, done at London December 8, 2004 (the "Agreement"¹).

Pursuant to the amendment procedure described in Article XIX(2), the Government of the United States of America proposes that Article XII(2)(h) of the Agreement be replaced with the following language:

"Information or equipment and Material provided or generated pursuant to this Agreement may be classified at any level up to and including "TOP SECRET".

The Embassy further proposes that this Note and the Foreign and Commonwealth Office's Note in reply accepting the proposal shall constitute an agreement between the Government of the United States of America and the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, which shall enter into force on the date of the Foreign and Commonwealth Office's reply note.

The Embassy of the United States of America avails itself of this opportunity to renew to Her Majesty's Government the assurances of its highest consideration.
